Tomorrow I plan on completing the learner guide and starting on the practice scenario guide.

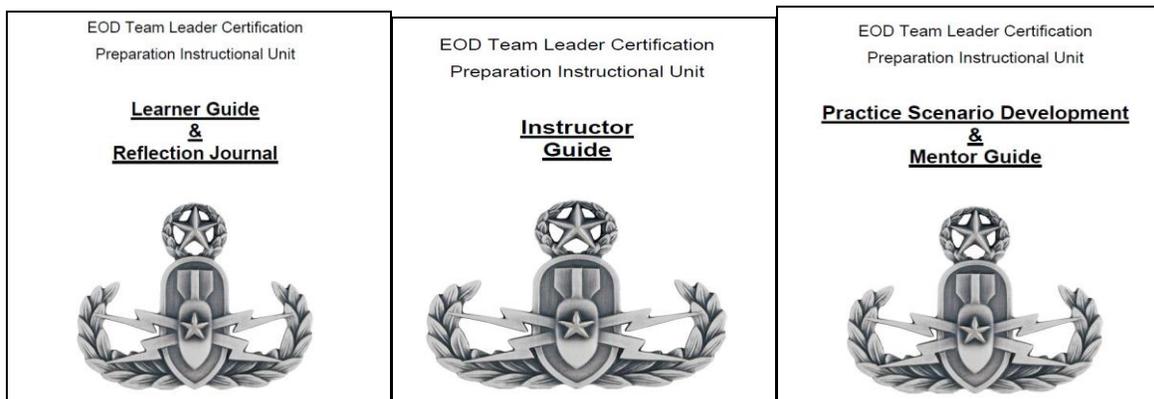
25 May, 2021

Thoughts

CSM(R) Boehme and CSM Gundersen are a wealth of knowledge and provided me with valuable feedback. Having been out of the field for the last while working here at the NCOLCoE, I lost track of some initiatives and their feedback helped to refresh my perspectives and thoughts on the EODTLC process. Thoughts

I think that this project is a BEAST! The detail levels one can go to are extreme and are proving to be difficult to handle for me and my OCD when it comes to projects. I got it all posted on the site, reviewed the rubrics, pulled it all back down, and spent all day modifying it. I got it all put back up and working on the links to the documents. I also

reviewed Andy D.'s project today and provided him with feedback. He is a great partner and helped me to see some of the things I missed. I also finished the rough draft of my classroom slide deck presentation.



Outcomes

After reviewing the rubrics, I found I have a lot more to do. I still need to the instructor's guide, build the written assessment and answer key, and class slides for the instructor guide. I will also need to incorporate feedback from Andy D. when he is done with his review.

1 June, 2021

- Need to elaborate on debrief/reflection sessions occurring after practice week training events with mentors.

Reflections on VS2 session

Watching other's presentations and incorporation of elements such as Merrill's first five, Gagne's 9, and other instructional methodology provided some clarity and ideas to incorporate into my project. The diversity of methods used by my peers presented a wealth of resources that should help to get me over the hump and down the hill. I think I am there with this project. The changes I made today were minor and nothing seemed to jump out as needing any major revision. I also think this project is intended to provide us with an idea of what it takes to design instruction. The statement Dr. K. has made throughout this program is that "instruction is purposeful, and it supports learning". I think this statement is critical in keeping the right frame of mind and has helped me to stay on the path without getting too distracted.

Outcomes

Revised project, a "belief" that I am 100% complete.

Way Ahead

I plan to await Dr. K's next office hour session, to get feedback on anything I may have missed, prior to submission.

7 June, 2021

Focus

Office hour with Dr. Koszalka for a review of my project.

Thoughts

Dr. K was very supportive of my project during our session. The feedback I received helped me to solidify my confidence in my project. Dr. K's questions to me focused on my thoughts about this project and we engaged in a healthy discussion on the process of design. We did review my project together, where I was able to gain Dr. K's concurrence with what I have designed. However, the discussion we had helped to provide me with perspective on the amount of time involved in the IDD&E process. The variables, such as stakeholders, environment, learner needs, etc. all build into this IDD&E "formula" that expand and adjust one's perceived timeline and requirements for a project. Further, we discussed how when designing and developing instruction, the adjustments and realizations an ID makes effect all other aspects of the project. In example, when I discovered the need for the practical assessment rubric, I also discovered that the rubric needed to be standardized for inclusion and involvement with the learner, instructor, and mentor guide. Ultimately the process builds upon itself and the ID must be able to recognize this and manage it throughout the process to design meaningful instruction that supports learning.
